St Ignatius of Loyola

Commemorating the 500th year of the conversion of St Ignatius (From May 2021 to July 2022)



St Ignatius was born as Iñigo de Loyola, in the castle at Loyola in the Basque Country of north eastern Spain in the year 1491. He was raised to be a courtier and a diplomat in service to the crown. Growing up around the royals, he was known for his glamorous lifestyle, his womanising, his dancing and his skills with the sword.

As a soldier of the Spanish army, he displayed acts of great courage that would bring great fame not only to the Spaniards but also to him. One such incident was the 1521 invasion of the French on the Spaniards. The Spanish army had given up hope of overpowering the French when Iñigo stepped up and led a brave fight only to have his leg shattered by a cannonball in the Battle of Pamplona, which turned out to be a life changing event for him. While nursing himself back to health he was given books based on the life of Christ and a book of the saints' legends.

Influenced by these stories he began a journey of transformation where he realised his powers of discernment, believing that God was leading him to a new and fulfilling life.

At 33 years of age he visited Barcelona where he would learn Latin grammar with students who were only 13 or 14 years old.

After his education in Barcelona, he went to the Spanish University to engage in conversation with people in matters of spirituality. Because he did not have any formal education in theology, these conversations got him in trouble with the Spanish Inquisition who jailed him thrice.

At the age of 38 he went to the University of Paris to attain a Masters degree. There, he met Peter Faber and Francis Xavier who would later become important members of the Society of Jesus.

In the year 1540 Ignatius along with a few of his friends from the University formed the Society of Jesus which was approved by Pope Paul III and thus became an official Catholic religious order.

As the Superior General of the Jesuits, he sent companions all over Europe and around the world. He called them to "hurry to any part of the world where...the needs of the neighbor should summon them." And he counselled them to serve "without hard words or contempt for people's errors."

The modern world is the result of ideas born out of thinking, labouring and leisuring individuals of the past, and continues to the present. Investment in ideas have taken us to space, made the world seem smaller through the internet, and unfortunately also torn people apart; it has created thinking machines, which may eventually decide our destiny.

Of all the actions, Education is probably the domain that spreads across the world, which can nurture and build responsible humans. Results

Strive towards academic excellence is the hallmark of Jesuit education. The untiring efforts of our staff and the hard work of our students to overcome the learning gaps created due to the pandemic found reward in the results of the Board Examination. Of the total 894 students who appeared in I PUC, 92.47% passed in science, 91.40% passed in commerce and 88.80% passed in Arts stream. The aggregate pass percentage was 91.72%.

In the II PUC Exam, the Science stream pass percentage was 97.26%, in Commerce 96.01% and in Arts stream we got 97.56% result. The aggregate pass percentage was 96.60%. 795 students appeared for the exam of which 218 students secured Distinctions and 452 students secured First Class.

Student Programmes

Students' Orientation: The inauguration of II PUC classes and orientation for the II PUC students were held on June 13, 2022. The Rector Fr Joseph D'Souza SJ and the Director Fr Cyril Menezes SJ urged the students to focus on academics and development of skills as they were at an important phase of their lives which could decide the pathway of their professional life and career.

The new admits to I PUC were welcomed to join the Josephite fraternity on June 13, 2022. The entire college campus mirrored a rural ambience with the decoration and lighting. The students added to the grandeur with their ethnic attire.

Union Day: A farewell party for the outgoing student council and class representatives was held on January 12, 2023. The I PUC student representatives along with the teachers organized a programme which included dance, music, games and cheer. The Vice Principal gave a heart-warming talk to the outgoing students. The students enjoyed the short yet memorable event.

Graduation Day: The final and most solemn event, the Graduation Day of II PUC students was held on January 13, 2023. Mr Christo Joseph, Alumnus of SJIHS and Director of Strategy & Planning at Garden City University Bangalore was the Chief Guest for the day. Mr Joseph C Babu, Alumni Association President, SJII was the Guest of Honor. The graduation batch of 2021-23 consisted of 801 students. Students who excelled in academics, sports and cultural events were honored during the programme.

Sports and Cultural Competitions: The teams of various cultural, sports and games of SJICPUC brought laurels to the college by winning competitions and tournaments that were conducted by the PU Board and by other organizations and institutions. These students, through their hard work and efforts held high the banner of college. The college will remain indebted to these participants for their contribution to add to the fame of the college.

Spiritual and Personality Development Programmes

His inspiring speech gained the attention of students as he gave some wonderful Ignatian principles for students to imbibe. The Chief Guest also spoke of the Ignatian Year, which is observed from 20 May, 2021 to, 31 July, 2022, to mark the 500 years of conversion of St Ignatius of Loyola after the cannonball struck his leg in the Battle of Pamplona. The highlight of the celebration at the college was the 500-member choir comprising of students, staff and alumni singing the Ignatian hymn Noble Knight.

Independence Day: The 76th year of the Indian independence was celebrated with much enthusiasm and grandeur. The Chief Guest, Commodore C D Balaji, hoisted the flag in the august presence of Rev Fr Joseph D'Souza SJ, the Rector of St Joseph's Indian Institutions, and the Institutional Heads of various units of St Joseph's Indian Institutions, members of the Inigo Sadan Community and staff. The meaningful celebration included an Inter-religious prayer service, significance of the day, patriotic song and a thought-provoking message by the Chief Guest and the Rector.

Few students were successful in winning prizes at the zonal, district, state, and national level.

Teachers' Day: Teachers' Day celebrations were organized by the Student Council on September 5, 2022. Students honored and entertained the teachers with a beautiful cultural program and fun games.

Gandhi Jayanthi: It was observed on October 2, 2022. A floral tribute was offered by the staff and students to the great leader. A short message was delivered by the Director Fr Cyril Menezes SJ.

Kannada Rajyotsava: The 67th Kannada Rajyothsava was celebrated on November 12, 2022, in the college with great enthusiasm. The chief guest of the function was the Director Fr Cyril Menezes SJ. The various programmes organized by the staff and students brought out the true spirit of Christmas which is the joy of sharing. The performance of the dance team, theatre team and the choir added flavor to the Christmas spirit. Staff sang special carols to add to the celebration.

This year the students and staff raised a sum of Rs 1,25,000 (rupees one lakh and twenty-five thousand) to help the visually impaired students of Jyothi Seva Home. This generous contribution lit the lives of the children in a small way and helped to spread the Christmas cheer among them. The inmates of Jyothi Seva Home reciprocated their gratitude by performing a dance on our campus during the feast celebration.

Republic Day: Republic Day was celebrated by hoisting of the Indian tricolor by Rev Fr Joseph D'Souza SJ, Rector of St. Joseph's Indian Institutions. The chief guest addressed the students and urged them to do their best and feel proud to be an Indian. The students brought the stage alive by decorating the stage apt to the occasion and expressed love of the motherland through their patriotic dance drama. The quadrangle reverberated with patriotic fervour and enthusiasm.

Institution Day: Institution Day was celebrated on 20 March, 2023. This day marks the feast day of St Joseph, the patron saint of the college. It is a day specially earmarked for all the staff of St Joseph's Indian Institutions to gather as one family to celebrate the achievements of the current academic year and to plan our path ahead. Student Enhancement Programmes

The students were given a variety of opportunities to showcase their talents and develop their interests, all contributing towards shaping their personality.

Electoral Literacy Club: The members of this club sensitized the parents and students about enrolling themselves in the electoral roll and to exercise adult franchise during elections. Parents' Orientation & Parent Teacher Interface: An orientation for the parents of the I &II PUC students was held on June 18 and 25, 2022 respectively. The class guides addressed the parents and helped them to understand their role as partners in the education of their children, to shape a good and successful future.

Parent Teacher meetings were held at regular intervals during the year. This provided a platform for parents to meet the class teachers, subject lecturers, and counselors to discuss the progress of their wards.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA): The PTA has played a very significant and proactive role in the institution. The PTA Executive Committee under the able guidance of Mrs. Lubna Salman the Vice President, met a few times during the academic year.

The Annual General Body Meeting of all the PTA units of SJII was held on November 19, 2022, in the institution auditorium. It was an official platform where the management addressed the growth of the institution in the current academic year and solicited the collaborative cooperation of the parents in all its developmental and enhancement programmes. The silver jubilarians of the high school were felicitated for their dedicated service during the programme. The class toppers in the II PUC board exam were also honored for their efforts. The programme culminated with a grand fellowship lunch.

Alumni/Alumnae Association

This association is another pillar of support to the institution. The alumni association under the able leadership of the President, Mr Babu C Joseph has been instrumental in setting a scholarship fund under the 'Igniting Minds' programme to help the deserving students of the primary school, high school and PU College to pursue their education without having to worry much about their financial constraints. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to all the donors, sponsors, and the hard efforts of the Alumni Executive Committee members in their initiative to give back and contribute to the development of their alma mater.



Sahayoga - Twinning Programme: The 'Sahayoga Twinning Program' aims at creating collaboration between St. Joseph's Indian Institutions, Bengaluru and Loyola Institutions, Vijayapura. This year the contribution of the college to this initiative was subdued as it was the come back year after the pandemic. We hope to rejuvenate our efforts and strengthen this programme in the forthcoming academic year.

Scholarships: The Ekanandan Scholarship is given to selected students from economically weaker backgrounds studying in St Joseph's Indian Primary School, High School, and PU College. It is sponsored by Mrs Vijayalakshmi Ekanandan who is a major benefactor of the institution. Fr Joseph D'Souza SJ, the Rector and Fr Cyril Menezes SJ the Director distributed the scholarships and addressed the students.

We deeply regret the sad demise of Mrs Vijayalakshmi Ekanandan on 4th February 2023. She will be fondly missed but the memories of her great deeds will linger on. The institution will always remember and remain indebted for her contribution in uplifting many of our students and supporting them to pursue their education. We pray that her soul may find eternal bliss and rest in peace.

SJICPUC believes in empowering the students belonging to the weaker sections of society. The management provides midday meals to deserving students. Around 50 students benefit from nutritious and sumptuous food that is provided to them through this scheme. 75 students in total were granted scholarships by the management.

Library. The partially automated library has a treasured collection of 5300 books, 17 journals, periodicals, magazines and 10 CD-ROMs. The library houses a photocopy machine for the convenience of its users and a few desktops with internet connectivity to enable browsing.

Infrastructural development: The Principal's office and college office received a face-lift this academic year after the renovation. Three new staff rooms were added to cater to the growing strength of the staff. The college building adorns a fresh look after the painting of its walls with elegant colors. The addition of plants in the garden and quadrangle aids in making the campus eco-friendly and green.

The student body comprising of 1702 young Josephites and 90 dedicated staff have made this campus vibrant throughout this year. Jesuit Conference of South Asia (JCSA) conducted a survey to evaluate the Management of different Jesuit institutions across South Asia.




































Teachers 'Hssociation (PTA)





The Constitution of India lays down the framework demarcating Fundamental Political Code, Structure Procedures, Powers and Duties of Government Institutions and sets out Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles and the Duties of Citizens.

ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆ ಕೂಡ ಮಾನವನಷ್ಟೇ ಹಳೆಯದು, ವಿಜ್ಞಾನದ ಜ್ಞಾನವಿಲ್ಲದೆ ಆದಿಮಾನವರು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ಸುಲಭವಾಗಿ ನಂಬಿದರು. ಇದು ಅನಕ್ಷರತೆ ಅಜ್ಞಾನದಿಂದ ಹುಟ್ಟಿ ಬೆಳೆದುಕೊಂಡು ಬಂದಿತು. ವೈಜ್ಞಾನಿಕ ಚಿಂತನೆ ಇಲ್ಲದೆ, ಮಂತ್ರ ತಂತ್ರ ಮುಂತಾದವುಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ನಂಬಿಕೆಯನ್ನು ಇಟ್ಟುಕೊಳ್ಳುವುದನ್ನೇ ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆ ಎಂದು ಕರೆಯಬಹುದು. ವಿದ್ಯಾವಂತರು ಸಹ ಇಂದಿನ ಸಮಾಜದಲ್ಲಿ ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ಅನುಸರಿಸುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಇದನ್ನು ಪ್ರತಿ ಗ್ರಾಮ, ಹಳ್ಳಿ ನಗರ ಎಲ್ಲಾ ಕಡೆ ಕಾಣಬಹುದು. ನಾವು ಹುಟ್ಟಿದಾಗಿನಿಂದ ಸಾಯುವವರೆಗೆ ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳು ನಮ್ಮನ್ನು ಕಾಡುತ್ತಿರುತ್ತವೆ. ಇದರಿಂದ ನಮಗೆ ಸಿಗುವ ವಿಷಯವೇನೆಂದರೆ ಸಮಾಜದ ಜನರ ಮನೋಭಾವನೆಯನ್ನು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆ ತನ್ನ ಹಿಡಿತದಲ್ಲಿಟ್ಟುಕೊಂಡಿದೆ ಎಂಬುದು ತಿಳಿಯುತ್ತದೆ.

ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆ ಪುರಾತನ ಕಾಲದಿಂದಲೂ ಬಂದಿದೆ ಎಂದರೆ ತಪ್ಪಾಗುವುದಿಲ್ಲ, ಇವನ್ನು ಅನುಸರಿಸುವುದನ್ನು ಕೆಲವು ವರ್ಷಗಳ ನಂತರ ನಿಲ್ಲಿಸಲು ಸಾಧ್ಯವಾಗುವುದಿಲ್ಲ. ಏಕೆಂದರೆ ನಮ್ಮ ಸಮಾಜದ ಮೇಲೆ ಮೂಢನಂಭಿಕೆಗಳು ಭಾರಿ ಪ್ರಮಾಣದಲ್ಲಿ ಪರಿಣಾಮ ಬೀರಿವೆ. ಅದು ಎಷ್ಟರ ಮಟ್ಟಿಗೆ ಅಂದರೆ ನಮ್ಮ ದೈನಂದಿನ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗಳ ಮೇಲೂ ಪರಿಣಾಮ ಬೀರಿವೆ. ಜೀವನದ ಎಲ್ಲಾ ಸಂದರ್ಭಗಳಲ್ಲಿಯೂ ಇದು ನಮ್ಮ ಸೂಪ್ರದಲ್ಲಿ ಇದ್ದೇ ಇರುತ್ತದೆ.

ಪಟ್ಟಣಕ್ಕಿಂತ ಹಳ್ಳಿಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ಅನುಸರಿಸುತ್ತಾರೆ ಎಂದು ವರದಿ ಬಂದಿದೆ. ನಾವು ಸಾಮಾನ್ಯವಾಗಿ ನೋಡುವುದರ ಪ್ರಕಾರ ಗಂಡಸರಿಗಿಂತ ಹೆಂಗಸರು ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ಹೊಂದಿರುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಇದರಿಂದ ಹೆಂಗಸರು ದೈಹಿಕ ದೌರ್ಜನ್ಯಕ್ಕೆ ಒಳಗಾಗಿರುವುದನ್ನು ನಾವು ಕಾಣಬಹುದು. ಬಡವರು ಮತ್ತು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆ ಇರುವ ಜನರು ವೈಜ್ಞಾನಿಕವಾಗಿ ಸಹಾಯ ಪಡೆಯುವುದಕ್ಕಿಂತ ಕಳ್ಳಸ್ವಾಮಿಗಳು ಮಂತ್ರವಾದಿಗಳ ಹತ್ತಿರಕ್ಕೆ ಹೋಗುವುದನ್ನು ನೋಡಬಹುದು. ಓವಿ ಮತ್ತು ಸಾಮಾಜಿಕ ಜಾಲತಾಣಗಳು ಇದನ್ನು ವಿರೋಧಿಸಬೇಕು. ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳಿಂದ ಹಲವಾರು ಜನರು ಮನಸ್ಸಿನ ಒತ್ತಡಕ್ಕೆ ಸಿಲುಕಿ ಬಳಲುತ್ತಿದ್ದಾರೆ. ಇದು ಆತಂಕವನ್ನು ಹೆಚ್ಚು ಮಾಡುತ್ತದೆ. ಇಂತಹ ವಿಷಯಗಳನ್ನು ಜನರು ನಂಬುವುದರಿಂದ ಸಮಾಜದಲ್ಲಿ ನಷ್ಟ ಉಂಟಾಗುತ್ತದೆ. ಮಾರುಕಟ್ಟೆ,

ಆರ್ಥಿಕತೆ, ವ್ಯವಹಾರಗಳಲ್ಲಿಯೂ ನಷ್ಟ ಉಂಟಾಗುತ್ತದೆ. ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿಗಳಾದ ನಾವು ನಮ್ಮ ಸಮಾಜವನ್ನು ವೈಜ್ಞಾನಿಕವಾಗಿ ಆಲೋಚಿಸುವ ಸಮಾಜವನ್ನಾಗಿ ಬದಲಾಯಿಸಬೇಕು. ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ನಿಲ್ಲಿಸಲು ಜನರನ್ನು ವಿದ್ಯಾವಂತರನ್ನಾಗಿ ಮಾಡಬೇಕು. ಮತ್ತು ಅವರಿಗೆ ದೈರ್ಯ ತುಂಬಬೇಕು. ನಮ್ಮ ದೇಶದಲ್ಲಿ ಅಷ್ಟೇ ಅಲ್ಲ ಪಾಶ್ಚಿಮಾತ್ಯ ದೇಶದವರೂ ಸಹ ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳನ್ನು ನಂಬುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಉದಾಹರಣೆಗೆ 13 ಸಂಖ್ಯೆಯ ಭಯವನ್ನು ತೆಗೆದುಕೊಳ್ಳೋಣ ಪಶ್ಚಿಮ ದೇಶದವರು ಈ ಸಂಖ್ಯೆಯನ್ನು ಅಶುಭ ಎಂದು ತಿಳಿದು ವಿರೋಧಿಸುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಕ್ರೈಸ್ತರ ಕೊನೆಯ ಸಪ್ಪರ್ ಇದರ ಮೂಲವಾಗಿದೆ. ಕ್ರಿಸ್ತರು ಕೊನೆಯದಾಗಿ ಊಟ ಮಾಡಿದಾಗ ಅವರ ಜೊತೆ 13 ಜನರು ಇದ್ದರು, ಈ ಕೊನೆಯ ಸಪ್ಪರ್ ಆದ ನಂತರ ಕ್ರಿಸ್ತರನ್ನು ಶಿಲುಬೆಗೇರಿಸಲಾಯಿತು.

ಇದರಿಂದ ಪಾಶ್ಚಿಮಾತ್ಯ ದೇಶದವರು 13 ಸಂಖ್ಯೆಯನ್ನು ಮಾರಣಾಂತಿಕ ಎಂದು ಪರಿಗಣಿಸುತ್ತಾರೆ. ನಮ್ಮ ಭಾರತ ದೇಶದಲ್ಲಿ ಹಲವು ರಾಜಕಾರಣಿಗಳು ಪ್ರಮಾಣ ವಚನ ಸ್ವೀಕರಿಸಲು ಮಂಗಳಕರವಾದ ದಿನವನ್ನು ಆಯ್ದುಕೊಳ್ಳುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಇದರಿಂದ ನಮಗೆ ತಿಳಿಯುವುದೇನೆಂದರೆ ದೊಡ್ಡ ದೊಡ್ಡ ವ್ಯಕ್ತಿಗಳೂ ಸಹ ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳಿಗೆ ಮೊರೆ ಹೋಗುತ್ತಾರೆ. ಗೌತಮಬುದ್ಧರು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಯನ್ನು ನಮ್ಮ ಸಮಾಜದಿಂದ ಕಿತ್ತೊಗೆಯಲು ಹಲವು ಪ್ರಯತ್ನಗಳನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿದರು. ಅವರು ನಮಗೆ ಮೊದಲು ಕೇಳುವ ವಿಷಯವನ್ನು ಕೂಲಂಕಷವಾಗಿ ಅಧ್ಯಯನ ಮಾಡಿ ಯೋಚಿಸಿ, ನಿರ್ಧರಿಸಿ, ಪರೀಕ್ಷಿಸಿ ನಂತರ ನಂಬಬೇಕು. ಎಂದು ಹೇಳಿದ್ದರು. ಆದರೆ ಇಂದು ನಾವು ಇದನ್ನು ಮಾಡುತ್ತಿಲ್ಲ. ಮೊದಲು ನಮ್ಮ ಮನಸ್ಸಿನಲ್ಲಿ ವೈಜ್ಞಾನಿಕ ಚಿಂತನೆಯನ್ನು ಬೆಳೆಸಿಕೊಳ್ಳಬೇಕು.

ಹೊತ್ತು ಮುಳಿಗಿದಾಗ ಉಗುರು ಕತ್ತರಿಸಬಾರದು, ಬೆಳಿಗ್ಗೆ ಏಳಬೇಕಾದರೆ ಬಲಕ್ಕೆ ಎದ್ದೇಳಬೇಕು, ಬೆಕ್ಕು ಅಡ್ಡ ಬಂದರೆ ಸ್ವಲ್ಪಹೊತ್ತು ಇದ್ದು ಹೋಗಬೇಕು, ಹೀಗೆ ನಾವು ಆಚರಿಸುವ ಪ್ರತಿಯೊಂದು ನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳೂ ಒಂದಲ್ಲ ಒಂದು ಕಾರಣಗಳನ್ನು ಹೊಂದಿರುತ್ತವೆ. ಆಕಾರಣವನ್ನು ಹುಡುಕಲು ನಾವು ಯಾವಾಗಲೂ ಆಸಕ್ತರಾಗಿರಬೇಕು, ಆದರೆ ಜ್ಯೋತಿಷ್ಯ ಹಾಗೂ ಇನ್ನು ಕೆಲವು ವಿಷಯಗಳು ಮೂಢನಂಬಿಕೆಗಳೆ, ಇದರಿಂದ ನಮ್ಮ ಸಮಾಜ ಬಹಳಷ್ಟು ಹಾಳಾಗುತ್ತದೆ. ಇದರಿಂದ ನಮಗೆ ನಮ್ಮ ಬಗ್ಗೆಯೇ ನಂಬಿಕೆ ಇಲ್ಲದಂತಾಗುತ್ತದೆ. ನಾವು ನಮ್ಮನ್ನು ನಂಬದೆ ಜೋತಿಷ್ಯವನ್ನು ನಂಬಿ ಅದನ್ನೇ ಅನುಸರಿಸುತ್ತೇವೆ. ಇದು ನಮ್ಮ ಮಾನಸಿಕ ಆರೋಗ್ಯದ ಮೇಲೆ ದುಷ್ಪರಿಣಾಮವನ್ನು ಮತ್ತು ನಕಾರಾತ್ಮಕ ಶಕ್ತಿಯನ್ನು ಬೀರುತ್ತದೆ. ಆದ್ದರಿಂದ ಸಮಾಜದಲ್ಲಿ ಜನರಿಗೆ ಮನಶಾಂತಿ ಇಲ್ಲದಂತಾಗುತ್ತದೆ. •

Following the talk, there was an interactive session with the speaker. Many insightful questions were satisfactorily answered by the speaker.






Event in Progress


